

Arranging Work For Alien Enemies

Federal Government in Commu- nication With Provincial Authorities

Ottawa, Nov. 20.—The best method of handling the alien enemies, who are now being registered in various parts of the country and who it is felt, should be interned, is now being considered by the Cabinet. Negotiations are in progress with the Provincial Governments to see if arrangements can be made to put them at work in the Provincial forests cutting wood for needy Canadians. In Ontario they would be placed at work under guard in Algonquin Park. In Western Canada they would be put at work in Rocky Mountain and Jasper Parks. There are two classes of prisoners, those interned because it is felt they are a menace to the community and those who are out of work and liable to be a burden to the country. It is felt that they should be put at some useful work, where they will not compete with Canadian labor.
