

MANY UNEMPLOYED IN WESTERN CITIES

Conditions No Worse Than in the
East—Unemployed Mostly
Alien Enemies.

Reports to the Labor Department from its officers in the west, show that, generally speaking, unemployment conditions are no worse than in the east. For the most part the unemployed are Germans and Austrians. These the government will look after.

Conditions are worse in British Columbia and Alberta than in Manitoba and Saskatoon. In Alberta the mines are either not working or only spasmodically.

The following are the unemployed in some of the western cities:—Vancouver, 8,000; Victoria, 3,000; Calgary, 6,000; Edmonton, 4,000; Regina, 1,500; Saskatoon and Moose Jaw, 900; Winnipeg, 3,600.
