

Many Foreigners Ask Naturalization

Large Crowd of Applicants at Office of Clerk of Peace To-day

The applications of 171 citizens of countries at present at war with the British Empire has been postponed to the end of the December sitting of the Sessions Court.

Certificates of naturalization were allowed to 740 former aliens at the September sitting. Nine, for various reasons, were refused.

The office of the Clerk of the Peace was busy to-day with a succession of men who in strange tongues asked for naturalization papers made out to strange names.

"I'm going to be a man now," said one burly newly-made British subject, who evidently felt that now at least he was a citizen of no mean country.
