

NO GERMANS AT QUEEN'S

There Was One There, But He Left
When the War Broke Out.

Kingston, Ont., Dec. 7.—There are no Germans on the staff of Queen's University. There was one when the war began, Professor Willhoft, of the School of Mining, but a few days later he left the country, going to the United States. Rumor said that he got out of country to avoid arrest, but he wrote a letter denying all charges made against him. However, as he had voluntarily left, the senate decided that his resignation should be accepted. This was accordingly carried out. He is now in Columbia University, New York, and has given evidence of strong pro-German views.

It was proposed later that all foreigners on the staff should become naturalized, but this has not been carried out, as there are none here who are in any way associated with enemies of the British Empire.
