

ALLEGED SPY RELEASED

Prof. H. C. Bailey Freed Through Intervention of Edmontonian

-MINOT, N. D., Dec. 17.—Prof. H. C. Bailey, of Boston, Mass., who was recently "detained" in Edmonton, Alta., by the Royal Northwest Mounted police on suspicion of his being an enemy of Great Britain and in the employ of the German government as a spy, has been released through the efforts of the United States consul at Edmonton. Bailey was in Minot today on his way back to Boston. "Do I look like a German?" asked Mr. Bailey. His question remained unanswered, for he certainly did have Teutonic features. In all probability, that is why he was arrested. Mr. Bailey stated that he had no passport at the time, and did not believe it would be necessary in Canada.

Mr. Bailey knew United States Consul George S. Montgomery and notified him at the time of his arrest. After much red tape, Prof. Bailey was set free.
