

MUELLER LIKELY TO GET HIS NATURALIZATION

Judge Coatsworth Has Not Given His Official Decision in German Prof.'s Case.

Registration of alien enemies is proceeding apace at the bureau on Adelaide street east. The process of examining these men — Germans, Austrians, Hungarians, and Turks— is a comparatively slow one, approximately fifteen minutes being required for the investigation of each individual. Nevertheless, 900 have been examined to date, at the rate of about 40 a day.

Since the protest lodged with Judge Coatsworth against the naturalization of the Reverend Professor P. W. Mueller, of the University of Toronto, on which judgment will be given by his Honor to-morrow, the crowd of aliens besieging the bureau has been greatly increased. At noon to-day fully 100 men were in waiting in the Adelaide street office. It is thought that the threat of protesting the naturalization of all alien enemies during the extent of the war has contributed to producing the rush.

Judge Coatsworth, registrar of alien enemies, makes three trips a day to the bureau—at 9 a.m., 2 p.m., and 5 p.m. His Honor personally examines such persons as are passed on to him by Captain Wandless, who himself decides on the palpable cases with the judge's supervision.

In spite of the present rush for registration it is estimated by Captain Wandless that many hundreds of alien enemies resident in Toronto district have as yet failed to put in an appearance. In time, however, all will be rounded up, though how long it will take to effect this cannot now be guessed at.

Following the removal last week of a large body of the foreigners interned at **Stanley Barracks**, Judge Coatsworth has been informed that there is plenty of room in the camp for further detachments of the suspected ones.

It is understood that Judge Coatsworth will grant Prof. Mueller his naturalization papers.
