

ALLEGED IMPERSONATOR REMANDED AT HAMILTON

Recruiting for the Third Force Commences, With a Ready Response

Hamilton, Jan. 6.—In the Police Court this morning James Toth, a **Hungarian**, who lives at 140 Ferrie street, was charged with voting in the recent municipal elections as James Toth, 341 Hughson street north. He was remanded. Steve Morley was fined \$100 for selling liquor without a license.

Recruiting Commenced.

Recruiting for the third Canadian contingent opened this evening in the Armories. The 13th and 91st Regiments are each asked to raise 103 men and officers. It is rumored that Lieut.-Col. S. C. Mewburn will be appointed Brigadier of the 4th division. Lieut.-Col. Bruce has been appointed commander of the 91st Highlanders, succeeding Lieut.-Col. McLaren. Although the officers received word only this afternoon to commence recruiting for the third contingent, there was a fine response. Each regiment was asked to furnish 103 men, and, although the weather was very bad, some 75 volunteers were received by both the 13th and the 91st Regiments. There will be no trouble to get the required number. Most of the volunteers are members of local regiments. The medical examination is very strict.
