THOUSAND ACRES MAY BECOME FEDERAL PRISON FARM—OTH-ER FOR QUEBEC.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Ottawa, Jan. 7.—The thousand acres of Quebec farm land in the Abitibi district, along "the National Transcontinental, north of Montcalm county, which has been transferred to the Federal Government by the Province of Quebec, is to be cleared and used as a detention farm for the Austrian and German prisoners of war. may become after the war a permanent prison farm in connection with the Canadian penitentiary system. The Minister of Justice has in view a system of prison reform for penitentiary convicts similar to that adopted by the Ontario Government at the Guelph Prison Farm.

An additional thousand acres adjoining the new Federal prison farm is also to be cleared for the Quebec Government as a model farm-by the Austrian and German prisoners.

PELEE VOTED WET.
