

BARON MACKENZEN TAKEN TO NANAIMO

Two of His Friends Also go
With German Accused of
Helping Foe

IRISH-GERMAN JAILED

Declared His Hostility to Em-
pire and Hipe if an In-
surrection

New Westminster, B.C., Jan. 18.—
Baron Karl von Mackenzon, Ernest
Ward Redlich and Hans Marcenich,
the three Germans who have been
detained in the Provincial jail, left
this afternoon under armed escort
for Nanaimo, where their cases will
be investigated by the authorities.
The three are suspected of having
aided German reservists to cross in-
to the United States from the Bar-
on's ranch at Port Kells, B.C.

A German Named Burke.

Predicting that in a little while
the German flag would wave over
the courthouse here, and declaring
that he was about to start an in-
surrection among the Germans, a
German bearing the Irish name of
Steven Burke was taken in charge
by the police Saturday. He will be
sent to Nanaimo military prison.

Burke was released on Thursday
from the Provincial jail after serv-
ing a two months term for flourish-
ing a revolver in Vancouver.
