SUSPECTED AUSTRIAN ARRESTED IN STRATFORD

LOUIS VON SHAFFER HELD ON SUSPICION OF ES. PIONAGE.

Stratford, Jan. 22.—Louis Von Shaffor, Austrian, well educated and well dressed, was arrested to-day on suspicion of being a spy, and is in jail pending investigation by the Ottawa authorities into the significance of letters found on him, in which reference was made to his having been a prisoner, with others, apparently in some detention camp. Von Shaffer put up at a local hotel and posed as a man looking for work. Of a reilgious charactor, he interviewed several city clersymen before being apprehended. Among his effects was found a , complete equipment for sketching.
