

Cannot Cope With Present Situation

Such is Comment of Mayor on the Civic Employment Bureau

"It is clear that the Employment Bureau is not able to cope with the unemployment situation. It must be thoroughly reorganized."

This was the comment made by Mayor Church to-day when he reported on the Social Service Commission on the number of people employed by the Bureau was laid before the Board of Control.

During the first eleven days in which the Bureau operated, \$125 was paid in wages. Since then the average wage account has been \$46, or \$425 since the doors were opened. During that time 6,189 persons registered at the Bureau, many of whom were found work.

An interim grant of \$500 was recommended to Council by the Board of Control to-day. Controller Thompson wanted the amount to be \$1,000, but as a report on the organization is expected from the Social Service Commission shortly, the lesser grant was decided upon for the present.
