## RICHARD ULBRICH'S DETENTION IN HANDS OF LIEUT.-COL ELLIOTT.....

Friends of Richard - Ullrich, -the Mount Dennis confectioner who is interned as an alien enemy at Stanley Barracks, are circulating a petition for the purpose of obtaining his release. Mrs. Ullrich and three friends, held a consultation with Mr. Julius D. Dreher, the American Consul, on Saturday, at the close of which he advised the party to take the matter up with Lieut.-Col. Elliot at the detention camps.

The party went to Stanley . Barracks, but whether or not they were, successful in securing freedom . for Ullrich has not been officially reported to Mr. Dreher. According to Mrs. Ullrich, her husband was born in Germany thirty-four years ago. They were married'in 1900, and her hussecured his naturalization band papers in the United States in 1904. Subsequently they took up a homestead near Haileybury. At her T0quest, Mrs. Ullrich says, her husband abandoned the farm on account of the rough life, and purchased a business two years ago in Mount Dennis. They have five children, the eldest being thirteen years old and the youngest one year old. Lieut.-Col. H. M. Elliot stated last

Light-Col. H. M. Elliot stated last night that he advised Mr. Bayliss, the Mount Dennis Magistrate, on whose information Ullrich was interned, to communicate with the Commissioner of Folice, Ottawa, on the matter. Ullrich, it seems, became an American citizen many years ago, but for the last ten years he has been residing in Canada.
