

# SUSPECTED MAN GIVEN RELEASE; NOT A GERMAN

## Wilkie, Bank, Bank Clerk, Al- lowed To Go His Way to England

ST. JOHN, N. B., Feb. 10—A. Scheller, who, when he arrived on the Atlantic Express Monday morning from the west, was detained because of something suspicious about his leaving a bank at Wilkie, Sask., where he was employed, and the fact that he possessed a German name, was released after a few hours.

He furnished satisfactory proof to the police that he was not a German, although his name would indicate such. He said he belonged to England and was of English parentage, although his ancestors were German. He said that he tendered his resignation to the bank manager, but did not wait for an acceptance because of his anxiety to get home. He wanted to catch the Corralcan here. He also furnished documents to show that he was in the civil service employ in England before he came to Canada last summer. The police released him and will allow him to go on the Corralcan.
