

## HORN ACTED UNDER ORDERS WILL FIGHT EXTRADITION

### Lawyer will Set Up Political Refugee Defence for German

New York, Feb. 15.—Convinced that he will be able to prevent the extradition to Canada of Werner Horn, German reservist, who attempted to dynamite the railroad bridge over the St. Crox River at Vanceboro, Me., on the Canadian border, Daniel O'Connell, his counsel, returned to Boston.

Mr. O'Connell obtained from Horn's trunk in the hotel of William Rohlf's in Arrietta street, Tompkinsville, S.I. documents which, the lawyer says, prove Horn's assertion that he is a German army officer. These documents he said, would make it impossible for this country to deliver Horn to the Canadian authorities, as they prove conclusively that Horn is a political refugee.

Mr. O'Connell declared that Horn was not alone in his attempt to destroy the bridge of the Canadian Pacific Railroad, and intimated that the reserve officer was acting under explicit orders.
