Wants Indian Unit to Go to the War

A unit of Indian warriors for the front is the scheme which Mr. F. Onondeyoh Loft hopes to carry into effect by calling a council of war of the Six Nation Indians. Mr. Loft. who is himself an Indian, spoke before the Men's Association Anne's Church last night on "The Indian on the Trail of War." He traced the history of his race and their connection with the English from the Treaty of New York, in 1664, and showed how the Six Nation Indians had never failed the British in time of trouble, and was always ready to take up the hatchet for the Union Jack. They would do the same today.
