

Charged With Evading Immigration.

Two American Germans and one German Swiss, named William Kerr, Alvis Knetzker, and Walter Roesslet, faced Colonel Denison to-day on a charge of entering Canada by evasion of the immigration laws. All three were remanded to March 1st without bail. And as a result of the case, R. G. Long and Co. will be summonsed.

Mr. Frank Garvey, for the department, explained the case in Court as follows:

"These three men lived in Mil-

waukee. They were employed to come to Toronto by the local firm to work as glovemakers. They were rejected at Sarnia and wired the Toronto firm to that effect. A man was sent to meet them, who sent their baggage by express and then brought them over on ferry via Windsor. The Toronto firm will be prosecuted."

The case will proceed next Monday.
