

# THREE INDICTMENTS AGAINST HORN FOR HANDLING DYNAMITE

## Illegal Transportation of Ex- plosives Charged by Fed- eral Grand Jury

BOSTON, Mass., March 3.—Three indictments charging the illegal transportation of dynamite in interstate commerce have been returned by the federal grand jury against Werner Horn, who attempted to destroy the international railway bridge at Vanceboro, Maine, on February 2. Federal attorney Geo. W. Anderson announced today. The maximum penalty for the offense is 18 months imprisonment and a fine of \$2,000.

A copy of the indictments was sent to the United States marshal at Portland, Maine, with instructions that Horn be arrested on Saturday on his release from the jail at Machias, where he is serving a sentence of thirty days for damaging property in Vanceboro.

It is expected that action on the Canadian government's requests for the extradition of Horn will be delayed as a result of the grand jury's report. In the opinion of the federal attorney the claims of the United States must be satisfied before extradition can be considered as the offense alleged in the indictments was committed prior to the attempt on the bridge.
