## SHOULD LETERN ALIENS IN THE NORTH COUNTRY

SUCH IS FEELING OF CHIZENS
EXPRESSED AT POROUPINE
MASS MEETING.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Timmins, Ont., March 21.—A large mass meeting of citizens of Porcupine district last night passed resolutions calling upon the Government to take immediate steps to intern all alien enemies in the north country. An amendment to the effect that the Government should first make investigation was lost by a large majority. Letters were read from various mine managers, most of them suggesting that the matter was too delicate to decide offhand, and advised that registration should be enforced and inquiry made.

As a result of the attempted dynk-miting of the Niplesing powder magazine by German Poles and the burning of two bridges on the T. & N. O. Ratiway on the same day, there has a very insistent demand that the Government shall take some step to put under better control the thousands of aller enemies working in mines throughout the north country No decided action has been taken it Cobalt, but several meetings have been held by the Board of Trade and other bodies, and a good deal of feeling has been aroused.
