

NO BILL AGAINST ROBERT SAYERS ON TREASON CHARGE

Robert Sayers, who has been in jail for some months waiting trial on a charge of treason for assisting Austrians out of Canada last fall, is once more a free man, for the grand jury this morning brought in no bill on the evidence against him.

True bills, however, were returned in the cases of Rex vs. Maki and Rex vs. Oleksuk. In the first case Sam Maki, of Chippewa, is charged with rape, and in the second Peter Oleksuk is charged with attempting to murder S. Fulchuk.

At the assizes yesterday afternoon the case of Weed vs. Greek and Dunn, for damages for trespass on timber lands, was referred to Judge Stone.

In the case of Wright vs. Ableson, for the winding up of partnership, the parties agreed to have Mr. C. V. Plummer, who has been temporary receiver, appointed permanent receiver and to have the case referred to the local master of titles.

In the case of Wesale vs. the Lake Superior Paper Company a jury was chosen as follows: John Brownlee, Jas. McGillivray, J. H. Haining, Dan McRae, Thos. Irwin, J. P. Somers, Thos. Brodie, J. E. Johnston, Christian Becking, Henry Willoughby Brown. In this case Karl Wesale, as administrator of the estate of Henry Pikelaga, deceased, sued the paper company for damages for the death of Pikelaga while employed on the log drive by that company.
