

# TEUTON PRISONERS HELD IN FT. HENRY REVOLT; ATTACKED GUARDS. INJURE 2

Lively Row Ends With Subjection  
of Interned Prisoners at Kings-  
ton—One German Stabbed  
With Bayonet Near Heart.

Kingston, April 30. — There was a lively row at Fort Henry last night when German prisoners made an attack on some of the guards. As a result two of the German prisoners are in the hospital, one in a serious condition as the result of a bayonet wound.

It appears that three Germans who had been given work in the kitchen had to be put in a dungeon for misbehaving themselves. They spent all day in the dungeon, and when the guards went to them with their meals last night they kicked up a fuss, knocking the food out of the hands of the guards.

A lively fight started between the prisoners and the guards. The guards drew their bayonets to quell the disturbance, and one German was stabbed near the heart and the other on his wrist. The former is in a dangerous state.

It looked as if the Germans had planned to attack the guards, but they were overcome in short order.
