

GUARD SHOT DOWN

A FLEEING AUSTRIAN

Prisoner Slain at Montreal—
Gen. Hughes Saw It and
Says Duty Was Done.

Montreal, May 3.—“You did your duty, my boy,” said Major-General Hughes, who on Saturday night at 9 o'clock saw a guard shoot and kill an Austrian, Jan Bauzek, at the Windsor station, who was trying to escape.

Bauzek was in a party of 106 Austrians who were being taken from the detention prison on St. Antoine street to the ~~detention camp~~ at Spirit Lake. Major W. E. Date, provost marshal, Captain Griffiths, and a guard had marched the prisoners to Windsor station, into which the Austrians were turning, when Bauzek made his break for liberty.

He had almost reached Stanley street, a short block away, when the guard called: “Halt! or I'll shoot.” After vainly shouting his warning three times, with Bauzek thirty feet away, the guard fired.

The guard in question is a French-Canadian soldier. His name is being withheld until the military inquiry into the affair is held.
