ALIENS REGISTER AT NEW BUREAU

Offices Changed Yesterday — Registrar Carpenter Called Upon for Other Work

The offices of the Registration

Bureau for Alien Enemies, which have been at 153 St. Antoine street since they were opened soon after the war began, were moved yesterday to 237 St. Antoine, in more spacious quarters. While the work involved by the registration of the Austrians and Germans in the city and district was exceedingly heavy for the first few months, the removal to Spirit Lake camp of many of the aliens, who had been interned because they had neither work nor means of subsistence, has greatly lessened the calls on the staff, which has recently been reduced.

It is understood that Mr. Silas H. Carpenter, the registrar, who directed the work of the bureau throughout the heaviest strain, will be called upon by the Government to act as Commissioner of Police and Parks for the Western Divisions, a position which he held prior to the outbreak of war, performing also some of its duties simultaneously with those of registrar. Mr. Hugh McColl, the registrar's chief clerk, has accepted a position in the C.P.R. department of investigation. The appointment of Mr. Carpenter's successor is not yet announced.
