HELPED ALIENS AWAY

Austrian Took Name Which Wife Could Pronounce

Six months in prison was the sen-

tence imposed yesterday by Judge Lanctot on Orifinz Szerovboi, alias Joseph Smith, alias Joseph Cohen, an Austrian, charged with vagrancy. Szerovboi, who said he had been in Canada for fourteen years, most of the time in Ottawa, had joined the 38th Battalion, but when it was discovered that he was an Austrian, he was ordered out, and he went from Ottawa to Cornwall. Szerovboi ad-mitted, when arrested by Inspector Giroux, of the Dominion Police, that he had, while in Cornwall, made a practice of getting Austrians and Germans out of the country into the United States, at the rate of \$10 for each person. When the accused was asked by Judge Lanctot why he had changed his name, Szerovbol said that he had married an English woman and because she could not pronounce or spell his Austrian name, he had taken the name of Smith.
