The members decided to dispense with the usual summer quarterly meeting, and arranged to hold the next session in October. It was stated by Secretary Skeaff, that twenty members of the Society are serving their country on the firing line, including quite a number of officers in the 48th Highlanders at the front.

Since the sinking of the Lusitania Police Headquarters have been be-siened by persons who claimed that paroled allen enemies were expressing their sympathies in strong pro-German ways. Some of them, however, have resulted in internments.
