Month's Internment May Do Teuton Good

Certain Toronto Germans are much exercised in their minds to explain how the sinking of the Lusitania was a glorious act of war. Ernost Sackl of 98 Ann street was interned yesterday by the registrar of aliens for arguing along these lines. He admitted that "it was a deplorable affair," but as the ship carried munitions of war it was right to sink it. He suggested that a fund should be raised to compensate the victims.

"Your idea is that it is all right to do murder on the high seas so long as you pay the relatives of the murdered," said Mr. Snow. "You reason very badly. You will be interned for a month and we will see how you behave."
