

APPEAL OF EMIL NERLICH

Court Reserves Judgment After Hearing Conspiracy Argument

Toronto, May 26.—Judgment in the appeal of Emil Nerlich from the verdict of the high court jury, finding him guilty of conspiracy to assist an alien enemy to leave the country, with a view to taking up arms with the enemy, was today reserved.

The argument throughout was largely technical in character. Many legal citations were made. On behalf of the appellant, it was argued that conspiracy to assist could not be established unless it be shown that more than one participated in the alleged conspiracy. The Crown argued that the indictment was sufficient to include Zirzow, the alien involved.
