CHARGE OF ESPIONAGE.

Baron Von Polenz is Arrested by the Dominion Police.

Ottawa, May 27.—Baron Von Polens, who for the past three years has been interested in Cobalt investments and has been prominent in Montreal and Quebec society circles, was arrested yesterday by Inspector Parkinson of the Dominion Police on a charge of espionage. He has been taken to the prison for allen enemies at Fort Henry, Kingston. The Baron is an ex-Captain of a German cavalry regiment, and has been under surveillance by the Dominion Police for some time.
