No Further Action Against Zirzow

Tearing of Document in Witness Box Not to be Followed Up

The act of Arthur Zirzow, the interned German reservist, in attempting to destroy a document bearing his signature while in the witness box at the trial of Emil Nerlich on a charge of high treason in the Criminal Assizes yesterday afternoon, may go unpunished, although the deed was an offence against the Criminal Code, which provides for punishment for mal-iclous destruction of documents. Mr. W. C. Mikel, K.C., frown Counsel in the case against Emil Nerlich. intimated to-day that as Zirzow already is a prisoner of war, his latast offence would not be followed by the pressing of a further charge against him.
