

War Prisoners Asked for Work

*Will Be Given Job of Building
New Roads in King-
ston Region*

Kingston, June 10.—The war prisoners at Fort Henry have asked for employment, and their wishes are to be granted. They are to be used in building a good road between the main road and Fort Henry, and to make some very necessary repairs to the road leading to Barrielfield camp, where upwards of 4,000 soldiers are being trained to fight the relatives of the war prisoners. If the prisoners, who number between 300 and 400, prove that they are deserving of the privileges that will come from seeing something of the outside world, an effort will be made to keep them employed. If not, they will go back to the monotonous solitude of confined walls.
