GIRL SPY CAUGHT IN TORONTO, WITH GREAT KNOWLEDGE OF SHELL MAKING

Nineteen-Year-Old German Girl, Giving Name of Louisa Marks Feldt, Arrested and Appears in Court on Nominal Vag. Charge.

SAYS SHE HAS PICKED MUCH NEWS IN CANADA

"My Government Leaves Nothing to Chance," She Boasts, and Then She Names Over Almost all Ont. Factory Locations.

Toronto, June 12.—Nineteen-year-old Louisa Marks Feldt, as she calls her-

self, who appeared in the Women's Court yesterday on a vagrancy charge, turns out to be one of the cleverest German spies on the continent. She was arrested two weeks ago as she boarded the train in the

Union depot.

She admits Feldt is not her right name, and defies the authorities to find out who she really is. She boasts of having assisted dozens of Germans

to go to the States and claims she has spent two years touring Canada, get-

ting military information.

"My government anticipates everything and leaves nothing to chance," she says. "Germany knows more of the secrets of rival nations than those nations can ever hope to know of Germany. It would startle America to know just how much information my country has concerning their supposedly secret affairs."

Off-hand, the girl named almost every point in Ontario where shells were being manufactured, and displayed amazing technical knowledge regarding war equipment.

It has not been decided whether she will be tried as a spy or simply interned.
