

# REGISTER ALL FERNIE ALIENS

Fernie, B. C., June 15.—(Special to The Herald.)—After making an inspection of the detention camp here, and gathering all available information regarding the procedure of the officials in interning the Germans and Austro-Hungarians, Col. MacPherson left this evening for Lethbridge, where he will also look into the conditions regarding the detention camp and those being held as aliens.

The officer in charge of the detention camp, Chief Constable Welsby, has been busy all day registering all Germans and Austro-Hungarians, whether naturalized or not, married or single, who were notified by poster yesterday to report for registration at once, under penalty of internment if the order is not complied with.

Over one hundred were on the roll in answer to this summons at five o'clock this afternoon.

Chief Welsby has received advice later that married men need not regard the above regulation, this being advice received since the posting of the first notice.

Four men from Waldo and one from Fernie were added to the internment list today, making a total of 321 now in the detention camp. Nothing definite has developed regarding a change of location of the camp.
