

# THE WINDSOR ARMOURY WAS ATTACKED BY ENEMY

## Bombs Did Damage to Walkerville Manufacturers.

### A GERMAN ARRESTED

DENIES HE HAD ANYTHING TO DO WITH IT.

The Plant Had Been Working Overtime on British Uniforms—Front of the Building Was Shattered—The Loss is Estimated at Some Ten Thousand Dollars—Attempts to Blow up Armoury.

Detroit, Mich., June 21.—A terrific explosion, alleged to be due to bombs set by German sympathizers, early to-day wrecked the overall manufacturing plant of the Peabody Company Limited, and the Leather Label Overall Company, in Walkerville, Ont., just across the river from here. August Frank, a German-American, and twenty-eight years old, was arrested in connection with the explosion but denied any knowledge of it.

The plant had been working overtime on a million dollar order for uniforms for the British Army. The entire front of the three storey concrete and steel building was shattered. The early estimates place the loss at \$10,000.

#### To Blow Up Armoury.

An attempt to blow up the armoury at Windsor, Ont., was made early to-day simultaneously with the wrecking of the overall manufacturing plant of the Peabody Company. Two hundred Canadian soldiers were asleep near the Armoury when a guard accidentally stumbled across twenty-six sticks of dynamite with the fuse partly burned.

It is believed on the Windsor side that a German spy smuggled himself across the border during the night and set bombs.

#### ONLY 151 SUNK.

London, June 21.—Eighty-two British merchantmen have been sunk, 75 of them by submarines, since the German submarine war was formally inaugurated February 18th, the Admiralty announced Saturday evening. In the same period, from February 18th to June 16th, seventy-six British sailing vessels have been sunk or captured. Total arrivals and sailings from British ports for the period were 24,442.

#### A Madman's Act.
