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Several Thousand Get Ready for Defence, but it is Only 4th Celebration in Detroit

Windsor, July 5.—Several thousand residents of this Canadian frontier town, who have been regaled for several weeks past with the stories of an impending raid of German-Americans, who, according to the detailed reports furnished, were to cross the Detroit River in small hoats, armed with all kinds of man-killing apparatus, were given a bad scare early this morning.

The distance separating Detroit from Windsor is less than half a mile, and soon after midnight this morning residents living along the river front and adjoining streets were awakened by sounds of heavy and continued firing.

Then came more quick, sharp staccato Everything pointed to a realization of the oft predicted "invasion" and the people came in hundreds to see the "enemy" land on alien shores.
