PORT ARTHUR AUSTRIANS SEEK VAINLY TO ESCAPE

OFFICERS OVERTAKE THEM AND THREE MEN ARE CHARGED WITH TREASON,

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Port Arthur, Ont., July 14.-Early tust after midnight. this morning. eleven local Austrians made an attempt to escape to the United States in a gasoline launch. Provincial Constable Symons and Sergeant Burleigh of the local police force hired a tug and overtook them in Thurder Bay. They made no resistance and are now in fail here. Barney Bell, a local entployment agent: Frank Volkman, an employee of Bell's, and Bert Ramshaw, owner of the launch, were arrested, charged with treason in aiding the party to escape. It is said the Austrians paid \$5 each to the heatman to procure their escape.

Nlagara Falls, Ont., July 14.—An attempt by five Austrians to leave Canada was frustrated last night by militiamen at the upper steel arch bridge. The foreigners are all residents of Falls View. They were interned at Victoria Avenue Armory, and will be sent to Stanley Barracks, Toronto, in a few days.

HORSE'S KICK KILLS BOY.

Mitchell, Ont. July 14.—Philip Stephens, an eleven-year-old English boy in the employ of Frenk Hinz, a Logan township farmer, was kicked in the chest by a horse as he was harnessing the animal, and died shortly afterwards.
