

Woman Alien Enemy Fails in Action

Husband Was Killed Three Years Ago—Sought Damages

Because Great Britain is at war with the Empire of Austro-Hungary, and because Anna Luczycki is a subject of that empire, her action against the Spanish River Pulp Mills, Limited, for \$5,000 damages for the death of her husband was dismissed to-day at Osgoode Hall by Mr. Holmsted, acting as Master-in-Chambers. In dismissing the action, however, the Master said that he did so without prejudice to another suit which might be brought at the conclusion of the war.

Luczycki, the husband of the plaintiff was a workman in the employ of the Pulp Mills Company, and on June 30, 1912, while working at Aspanola, Ontario, he was killed on a revolving shaft. He left a widow and a daughter, four years old, in whose behalf the action was brought.
