SOO SENDS MORE MEN; PROMISES TWO GUNS

Rousing Send-off to Fifth Contingent—Other Squads Go to Camp

(Special Despatches to The Globe.) Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., July 28. — Fifty more men, comprising the Soo's fifth contingent, were given a rousing send-off this afternoon as they left for Ningara. In addition to sending these men the City Council has decided to contribute two machine guns, one to be paid for by the city and the other by public subscription.

Forty interned prisoners, also left this morning for the internment camp at Kapuskasing.

Welland, July 28.—Welland gave a rousing farewell to a quota of 175 men, under command of Capi. Briscoe, who left to join the 76th Battalion at Niagara Camp. The quota included more than fifty young men of Welland secured by a special appeal of the 44th Regiment for residents of the town to enlist. The past two contingents have had very few actual residents of Welland.
