
1,400 NOW INTERNED AT KAPUSKASING CAMP

AUSTRIANS AND **TURKS** GIVE THE GUARDS VERY LITTLE TROUBLE.

Lieut.-Col. Cowan has been asked to send five more Army Service men to Kapuskasing Camp, Northern Ontario, where 1,400 Austrians and **Turks** are now interned. There are only some ten A. S. C. men at the camp now, but the interned, of course, can do a lot of the laboring work. The camp, however, has become a regular town and the Army Service Corps have to run a hardware store to supply the needs of those engaged clearing the land and working on the railroad, for numbers of the prisoners are now working on the Transcontinental right-of-way, a class of labor they are used to. There are two railroad camps outside of Kapuskasing. The prisoners are paid about 25 cents a day, and give little trouble to their guards.

A parade of No. 2 and No. 12 Companies, A. S. C., has been called for Friday night at 8 o'clock and each succeeding Friday till further notice. Only those men who attend drill will be accepted for overseas drafts.

Recruits for the 92nd Highland Battalion are coming into the Armouries as fast as the officers of the 48th Highlanders can handle them. Thirty-nine passed the doctor yesterday.

H. W. JOSELIN'S DEATH.

Former Civic Assessor and Bullder
Expired on Street Car.

The funeral takes place to-morrow afternoon at the Necropolis of Harry W. Joselin of 442 Ontario street, who expired suddenly in a King street car while returning home from a visit to his daughter.
