

# **NO CAMERAS, NO BINOCULARS, ALLOWED ON PARLIAMENT HILL**

## ***All Entrances Closed But Main One; No Tour- ists Allowed About Except Those Identified by a Citizen***

Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 11.—They are growing stricter on Parliament Hill, and it will soon be as difficult to reach the Parliament Buildings as for Canadian newspapermen to visit the trenches in Flanders. Cameras are now forbidden, much to the chagrin of tourists. Whether it is thought a spy might get a photo of the buildings for the use of the Germans or whether it is feared a bomb might be hidden in a camera has not been explained. Several camera men have recently been hailed be-

fore the Dominion police. Field glasses are also prohibited.

For some time all entrances to the Parliament Buildings and the main public buildings have been closed, except the main entrance. This is regarded as a very sensible regulation, as it allows the police to scrutinize closely all strangers, and prevents a crank such as set a bomb in the White House doing any depredation. Strangers are now forbidden to the House, except with a pass or accompanied by escorts prepared to vouch for their identity.
