

ARE RAILWAY EMPLOYEES HELPING ALIENS TO LEAVE?

THREE FOREIGNERS WHO CROSS- ED LINE IN G.T.R. FREIGHT CAR SENT BACK.

Sarnia, Aug. 11.—That employees of the Grand Trunk Railway in Toronto are receiving money from foreigners for taking them to points outside of Canada is a story told here to-day, when three foreigners were deported from Port Huron, where they were shipped from Toronto last night in an empty freight car. They were, it is alleged, charged \$2 and \$5 by employees of the company, who then locked them in a car going to Port Huron. The men got safely into the United States, but the car was opened by immigration men there, and the men were sent back. The case is being taken up by the local police.

Officials of the G.T.R. in Toronto had heard nothing of the matter last night, although it may not be reported here direct, but to Montreal.
