

HUNS AT AMHERST NOT ABUSED, SAYS GENERAL HUGHES

Prisoners Provided With Same Rations Given To Canadians

LONDON, Aug. 28.—The following are gazetted today: Lieut.-Col J. Elmsley, Royal Canadian Dragoons, as brigade major attached to headquarters units; Lance-Corporal L. Ruggles from the Canadian divisional cycle corps, second lieutenant in the Hampshire regiment of territorials; Private Martin K. Duval, from Canadian division, to second lieutenant in a London regiment of territorials; Private K. T. Creery, 16th Canadian battalion, to temporary second lieutenant.

Further confirmation of General Hughes' statement regarding the treatment of German prisoners at Amherst is given by Lieut. Ross Millar, who was medical in charge of the camp. In a letter to the Daily Mail he says: "Unofficially I can deny the German charges. The rations were exactly the same as the Canadian soldiers were allowed. Complaints were carefully considered and any reasonable improvements suggested by prisoners were followed when possible."
