

Speaking of the encampment of large bodies of men in Toronto in the coming winter, and the accompaniments of a dry camp and a wet city, he suggested it might be thought beneficial to forbid soldiers in uniform being served with liquor after 7 o'clock at night. Failing restrictions on drinking in cities where soldiers are in camp, he favors the sale of light beers at camp canteens.
