

# MAN ARRESTED IS RESPA NOT CARL SCHMIDT

## Took Brother-in-law's Name to Hide Identity—He is Remanded

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Aug. 30.—After several hours' work on the part of the Provincial officers who made the arrest, assisted by Detroit detectives, the identity of the man arrested on Bois Blanc Island, opposite Amherstburg, Sunday afternoon, on suspicion of being one of the gang responsible for the Windsor dynamite outrages, was definitely established early this morning as Charles Respa. The name he first gave—Carl Schmidt—was discovered to have been assumed by Respa.

**Brother-in-Law of Carl Schmidt.**

Respa, whose first name was Karl when he lived in Germany, is 26 years old, and a brother of Mrs.

Carl Schmidt, whose husband was arrested with Gustav Stevens for an attempt to dynamite the Nipigon bridge of the Canadian Pacific Railway last spring. Both men are interned at Kingston.

Ever since the attempt to dynamite the Peabody plant in Walkerville the Dominion police, Provincial police and Detroit detectives have known of Respa's alleged connection with the plot. In order to divert suspicion, they gave out information that Carl Schmidt was the third man implicated in the dynamiting.

**Is Silent; Remanded Eight Days.**

Arraigned in Walkerville Police Court this morning before Magistrate Miers, Respa stood mute when two charges—one of conspiring to dynamite the Peabody Overall Factory in Walkerville and the other charging the actual commission of the deed—were read to him. He was remanded for eight days.

**Attempted Suicide Denied.**

A Detroit evening newspaper printed a story this evening to the effect that Respa had made a desperate attempt at suicide by cutting his wrists with broken edges of his watch crystal, but the authorities at Sandwich Jail, where Respa was removed at noon, emphatically deny that any such attempt was made.

This new arrest may lead to a Federal investigation of the "Bomb Bund," which has been supposed to exist in Detroit. It is said the secret service men who tipped off the Provincial police to Respa's return to Detroit have evidence that the house at which the man stayed is the headquarters of a clique of dynamiters, whose activities extend over the greater portion of the United States.
