INTERPRETER CHARGED WITH DISLOVAL ACTION

After taking evidence all day Magistrate Elliott sent Friedman for trial in the District Court, and admitted him to bail in \$2,000. ris announced this morning that if a majority of the voters of the Province approve prohibition of the sale liquor when the referendum is sub-mitted to them next March no new licenses or renewals of present lidotted to them next March no new licenses or renewals of present licenses will be granted by the Government when the licenses automatically expire May 31 next.
