

Two Hunters Arrested As German Spies

"Do we look like Germans?" was the question put by R. A. Hogner and E. F. Perry, both of Boston, Mass., who reached the city on Saturday on their way home after a very interesting trip to Lanark county. The two tourists were on a hunting trip. A short distance outside of Smith's Falls they were arrested by a county constable and brought to Smith's Falls jail. They were first charged with being German spies but this was changed, when no support of the charge could be made, to that of unlawfully carrying fire-arms to hunt game. They showed a letter from the Department of Mines and Fisheries showing their authority, but this did not go. They were released with the understanding that they give up their hunting plans. Their rifles were confiscated.
