

# ***Prisoners At Fort Henry Should Work***

The Grand Jury submitted its report at closing session of the fall assizes Friday morning. It strongly objected to interned prisoners in Fort Henry being kept in a state of idleness. It was of the opinion that they should be made to work on roads near the city, and thus pay a part at least, of their maintenance.

The jury also felt that children in the Orphans' Home should be placed in homes at an earlier age than at present, and should be placed with farmers rather than in city homes, and thus relieve in some measure, the scarcity of farm help.

Another recommendation of the jury was that the old wash tubs at the Infants' Home be abolished, and that more sanitary methods be adopted.

Referring to tuberculosis, the jury asked that the care and treatment be put under Government control and support.
