ceptance.

German. Good humored acceptance, because the Bulgarians, once a fine colony

of 3,000 a year ago, are now a handful, numebring at the most 500 in and around Toronto—and even among these are only perhaps a

hundred of actual Bulgarians.
"Alien enemies!" chuckled one of

"Alien enemies!" chuckled one of the leading men in the colony, who speaks the English he has polished in the Public Library. "We Bulgarians are enemies of no one! We have had enough of war. Seven centuries of it ought to sicken anybody." "What will you tell the Registrar of Aliens?" asked The Star. "That although we are Bulgarians by speech and race," replied the Bulgar, "we are by country Turks, Serebians. Greeks. Maccdonlans, and not

bians, Greeks, Macedonians, and not very enthusiastically of any. Three-

very enthusiastically of any. Three-quarters of the Bulgarians in Ameri-ca are subjects of other powers. And the quarter who are subjects of Bul-garia say, 'Let kings and Ministers fight.' You see, democracy has come even to the Balkans.

"At the time of the Balkan war, few, less than a hundred, returned from all Canada to fight for Bul-garia. Thousands came out after the war, with the hundred who had gone back. They came to escape war. And I know there are tens of thous-ands trying to come to America who cannot for the lack of a few dol-lars."

lars." Ten out of the fifteen restaurants of the colony are closed. More than half of the lodging houses are vacant. The colony of 3,000, but a year ago so full of noise and laughter, is now only a deserted village. They have gone to the States to find work. according to every merchant left, not to fight against the allies.
