Mr. Andoff spoke in Buigarian, and is address was interpreted for the press. He told the gathering that nowhere in the world was there more iverty than in Canada. He declared unphatically that every man who was against Canada should be punised accordingly. The country meadid good, loyal men, and could not logenate recording the Buigarian king, he said, should so back to Austria and play again with the Ausrian officers. The matter really settled down to this: Buigarian for the Subgarians, Sterbia for the Serbians, Greece for the Greeks, and Macedonia for the Macedonians

Mr. N. Shonteff, the official Bulgarian interpreter, also spoke briefly, the pointed out that they had been protected by Canada, and should interefore be loyal. The liberator of Sulgaria would be Russia. The Bultarians must be faithful to this country and must respect the Government. There was no doubt about how the war would end. German militarism would be crushed, and the Britism Bulge crushed, and the British Empire will give freedom to evpr nation and to the world. Rev. T. T. Shields, pastor of Jarvis Street Baptis church, told them that the police restriction would be strict to those not in sympathy with Brit-

ain. There was no place except the internment camp for such. If they were loyal they were welcomed as wood citizens.
