Since September, 1914, the Torono Women's Patriotic League has disributed over 48,000 soldiers' comforts and miscellaneous articles valied at over \$26,000. These comforts have been sent both overseas and to soldiers on guard at the various internment camps. TWO large cases containing Christmas stockings and akes, gramophone records and other comforts have been sent to the garrison at Kapusasing internment camp n Northern Ontario, while four cases of comforts have been shipped overieus during the past week.
