ing after his 7,200 interned allens has been that of securing sufficient winter clothing. The Canadian and British governments and the govern-

ments of the allies have been so busy purchasing clothing for their troops that the Canadian manufacturers have been scarcely able to meet the de-

mands General Otter has had a good deal of trouble, therefore, in securing boots, socks and underwear for his prisoners of war. There was no difficulty in obtaining the other clothing. In one western camp the work had to be suspended when winter came because the men were literally on their uppers. A new camp is being established at Jasper Park, north of Yellowhead Pass. This makes eight working campa in Alberta and British Columbia,
