

CHRISTMAS AT THE INTERNMENT CAMP

Concert Being Arranged by the Interned Aliens Some of Whom Are Talented Musicians

Prisoners of war in the internment camp here will be allowed to entertain themselves in their own manner on Christmas Day. As far as possible the day will be observed as a holiday although most of their days are holidays anyway.

The only difference on Christmas Day will be that they will not have to go through the usual parades and march out. Necessary work in their quarters will of course be attended to.

A kind of concert is being arranged by the prisoners, which they have received permission to carry through. There is considerable talent among them, music teachers as well as laborers being interned together and a quite satisfactory concert is likely to be produced. Most of the singing will be in Polish.

Christmas parcels have been coming in in large numbers to the camp of late. They are mostly composed of tobacco and foodstuffs.
